

- 1. Have I noticed any changes in a child's behaviour, emotional state or relationships today?
- 2. Am I actively observing for signs of harm or stress, not just guiding behaviour?
- 3. Is everyone on our team interacting with children in a respectful and professional way?
- 4. Have I seen or heard anything from a colleague that makes me uncomfortable or raises a concern?
- 5. Do I know what to do and who to speak to if I'm worried about a child or adult's behaviour?
- 6. Does my team feel safe to speak up if they have a concern, and do they know who they can speak with?
- 7. Have I documented observations clearly and factually when I've noticed a potential concern?
- 8. Are our child protection policies clearly understood, followed and discussed regularly and openly within our team?

## Child safety in early education Reflective questions



- 9. Do we have a clear policy that prevents adults, including educators and teachers, from being alone with children?
- 10. Am I modelling a child-safe culture through my language, interactions and professional boundaries?
- 11. Are there any areas in the service where a child and adult could be interacting without others seeing?
- 12. What opportunities do we offer children and young people to participate in your organisation at a level where they have input in decision-making?
- 13. What opportunities does our organisation offer to children and young people to provide feedback on their experience of our service and how do we act on this information?
- 14. How do our staff demonstrate they understand the importance of children's views and opinions?
- 15. How do we elicit the views of children of all ages, abilities and cultural backgrounds?
- 16. Are children given the skills so they are better able to understand their feelings and, if so, how does this occur?
- 17. How does our organisation encourage children to raise any concerns they have?
- 18. How do our policies reflect the importance of empowering children and young people?
